Carole is survived by her sons, Patrick Neal Parker and Daniel Geiogamah Parker, both of Albuquerque, and five grandchildren, Rachel Parker of San Diego, Ca; Michelle Parker of San Francisco, Ca; Cheryl Parker of Irvine, Ca; and Sara Parker and Samuel Parker of Albuquerque. She studied nursing at the Pennsylvania Hospital School of Nursing in Philadelphia and continued her education at Cameron University in Lawton. She received a Bachelors degree in business administration from the University of Science and Arts in Chickasha in 1976. She was employed with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for over 20 years in the Washington, D.C. headquarters and also in the Albuquerque Area Office. She was on the staffs of the Bureau's Office of Special Trustee and the BIA Trust, the Indian Youth Recreation Program and the BIA Adult Assistance Program. She retired in 2007. Carole loved music, gardening, cooking, crab fishing, collecting and travelling to visit friends and family. She cared very much for her family and friends and always extended a helping hand to those in need. Lyntha Klinekole will provide music for the services, and dinner will be served at Iscani Hall of the Wichita Tribe following burial.
