January 5, 1918 - June 2, 2015

Geneva B. Randolph passed away on June 1, 2015 in Anadarko, Oklahoma. She was born January 5, 1918 on a farm near Lefore, Texas, the daughter of Leslie and Vera Bobbitt Glasscock. She began her education by attending the first grade in a one-room school near Panhandle, Texas. She did the remaining school years in Snyder, Texas where she graduated from high school in 1936. She earned the B.A. degree in education from Phillips University in 1940. Geneva was united in marriage with Earl Randolph on February 1, 1947. This union was blessed with two daughters. She taught for six years in elementary schools in Texas before moving to Oklahoma. Geneva was employed by First State Bank, Gage, for several years before she resumed her teaching career in 1966, teaching second and third grades until her retirement in 1982 from the Gage Public School system. Geneva was Ellis County Teacher of the Year for the 1980-81 school year. When Gage Lumber and Hardware was purchased by Earl and Geneva in 1972, she became bookkeeper for the company and continued in that capacity until December of 1988 when the business was sold. She and Earl shared the honor of being chosen Northwest District Rotary Citizen of the Year in 1988. She was a member of O.E.A. and American Legion Auxiliary. Geneva was baptized into Christ at the age of eleven and remained a faithful member of the Christian Church Disciples of Christ until her death. Her greatest interests were: church, home, family, and her third graders. Geneva is preceded in death by her parents; a step-father; husband, Earl in 2002, a sister; her brother, Rodney

Glasscock and his wife, Eileen; nephew, Robert Glasscock and many others.
