James Edward Fuller was born on October 27, 1940, in Raymondville, Texas. His parents James Jackson and Lottie B. Fuller raised their 12 children on the family farm. In time the family relocated to Fort Cobb, Oklahoma where James grew up and spent his life. James and Judy were married on September 8, 1959. On February 23, 1961, Judy gave birth to their first daughter Debra Fuller who was born with a full head of dark brown hair. Two years later, their daughter Stephanie, a beauty, was born with blonde hair that grew out later. James was a Custom Harvester, and he started his annual run in Texas, and they cut wheat to the Canadian Border. After cutting wheat the family would head south to Mississippi where they would cut beans until near Thanksgiving. The Custom Harvesting was a family affair. While the men would cut wheat from sunup to late in the night, the women prepared meals to keep the operations going. James also ran a farm equipment business and loved his cattle that for years he named every cow and calf in his pasture. James Fuller transitioned from earth to his heavenly home on Monday, October 24th. He is preceded in death by his mother and father, and 11 siblings. He is survived by his wife Judy of 63 years, two daughters and their husbands, Amel and David, grandchildren Tephania and Brandon and their spouses Thomas and Jessica, loved like a grandson Derek Coley, Great grandchildren Kaden, Kohlton, Avery, and Solomon, many family members, great community, and friends. Funeral services are at 1:00 P.M., Thursday, October 27, 2022 at the Apache First Pentecostal Holiness Church in Apache,

Oklahoma. Rev. David Sidebottom will officiate. Burial will follow in the Almost Heaven Cemetery near Fort Cobb, Oklahoma. Services are under the direction of Fort Cobb Funeral Home.
