



## Michael C. Crouch

June 26, 1953 - September 15, 2020

Michael C. Crouch, 67, passed away after a brief illness at the V.A. Hospital in Oklahoma City on Tuesday, September 15th, 2020. He was born on June 26, 1953 in Oklahoma City, OK to Charles William and Leila Belle (Callaway) Crouch. He graduated from Anadarko High School in 1971. He served his country in the US Navy during the cold war and in the Vietnam Conflict. He was proud of the fact that he had received his Golden Shellback on the U.S.S. Proteus and stationed on Guam. The remainder of his service was spent on the U.S.S. Dixon in San Diego, California. He married Jimmie Kay Coffman on December 24, 1974 in Oklahoma City, OK. In 1976, he went to work for Western Farmers Electric Cooperative and retired after 30 years. He then worked 7 years at OG&E. Most recently he was employed by Family Cannabis. During his youth he was active in the Boy Scouts and received his Order of the Arrow. He also attained the rank of Eagle Scout. He became assistant Scoutmaster and worked many years teaching youth about scouting and sharing his love of the great outdoors. He was active with the Boy Scouts, Explorers and the Girl Scouts. In his spare time he enjoyed riding and working on motorcycles, camping, sailing and scuba diving. One of his greatest joys was entertaining his grandchildren.
