January 6, 1935 - December 6, 2020

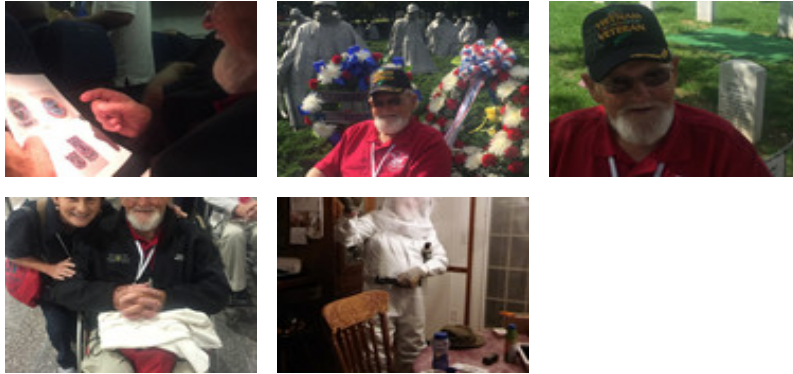
