Obituary Perry Brent Beverage, age 59, of Hobart, IN died Wednesday, February 10, 2016, at his apartment in Greenwood, IN. Perry was born Nov. 5, 1956 in Anadarko, OK, to Audie Virgil and Doris Pauline (Hatchett) Beverage. He graduated from Anadarko high school in 1975, and from the University of Central Oklahoma with a BS Ed with a minor in business administration. He joined his father's business and sold insurance. Later in life he became a project manager, installing Lawson software in hospitals around the country. Most recently he was working for Eli Lilly in Indianapolis, and was continuing to develop a coaching business, "What Success Looks Like." He was an active member of Bethel Church in Crown Point, IN. Perry is survived by his wife of 36 years, Pamela (Sanders); his daughter and son-in-law Amy and Lance Peeler of Wheaton, IL; their children Katherine, Maxson, and Kindred; his son and daughter-in-law Cody and Allison (Tarpley) of Edmond, OK; his two sisters Cherry Marquez and her husband Lorenzo of Englewood, CO, and Sharon Geer of Midwest City, OK; his nieces and nephews Monica Marquez, Christine (Marquez) Hudson, Joshua Geer, Jessica (Geer) Fields, James Sanders, Darin Sanders, Randy Sanders, and Savannah (Sanders) Doland; and a host of cousins. He is preceded in death by his parents, A.V. and Doris Beverage, and brother Virgil Max. Perry had a large heart and a great smile. Whether it was helping with computers, negotiating at car

dealerships, or planning family vacations, one of his greatest joys was spending time together. Papa Perry never missed a chance to be there to support his children and grandchildren.
