She worked and helped manage what grew into a large farm. After graduating from Irving Consolidated School, Sally went on to Cameron College in Lawton where she met her future husband, Lee (Jack) Young. After marrying and graduating there, they went on to Oklahoma A&M (later OSU). Sally graduated with honors with a degree in "Home Ergonomics" and a minor in English. Their first child, Patricia, was born while living in Stillwater. They then taught school for a short time, but farming was in their blood. So they settled on their first farm overlooking the Washita River Valley, north of Fort Cobb. Their two sons were born there. Times were tough and they were forced off the farm by drought, but they managed to keep the farm, returning a few years later, and this time, with irrigation, the farm flourished. Along the way, Sally also taught school at Broxton, Oklahoma for awhile, Home-Ec, HS English, and her favorite, Head Start. Til the end, little kids were drawn to Sally. But mostly she helped run the farm and still had time to grow big vegetable gardens, flowers and fruit trees. Her love of nature brought her much peace. For the last 8 years, Sally brought joy and smiles to

the other residents and staff of the nursing home where she lived. She always worried about the health of her friends and staff there. Hardly ever dwelling on her own problems. Even when in great pain, she would manage to smile. Even during the current COVID 19 isolation, she was trying to make the best of things. But the loneliness was wearing on her. She needed her family. She needed hugs! Sally is preceded in death by her parents, by her husband of almost 68 years, her brother, Frank Hall, and a brother-in-law, John Critchfield.
