Wallace Bitseedy was born October 6, 1940 in Lawton, Oklahoma to Catherine Bitseedy. He grew up in the Fort Cobb and Carnegie area and graduated from Carnegie High School with the class of '61. He went on to further his education and graduated from BYU and Northern Arizona University with multiple degrees, including Liberal Arts and Psychology. In 1962, Wallace married Frances Medrano in Anadarko, Oklahoma. They raised their family, living in Utah and Oklahoma where his work would take them. He coached basketball, football, along with track and field for many years. He was a seminary teacher for 11 years. He served as state presidency and branch presidency. Wallace was baptized in 1972, sealed to Frances and Denise in 1973. Wallace was loved by all who knew him and is mourned greatly by his passing.
